



Sign Up!

Spell out a name on a *VERY* personal banner. Make a room sign for the proud parents to display. Create a great reading- readiness toy for a special kid. Or, mark your own grown-up territory with personality plus!

Felt makes it quick and easy, ribbon or rickrack adds kickiness. YOU design the sign, choosing colors and print fabric to match the space, and customizing the size and the style and lettering. What could be more unique and fun?

SUPPLY LIST

NOTE #1: I'll have lots of lettering templates, extra felt and rickrack.

NOTE #2: Bring a bunch of fabrics from your stash, and you'll zero in on your best choices at the workshop.

NOTE #3: Prewash fabrics to pre-shrink them and press to remove wrinkles. Be sure to prewash and machine-dry wool or wool-blend felt if you are not using polyester craft felt.

- For separate lettered pockets or patches: fat-eighths (9" x 11" rectangle) and scraps of various print fabrics. Stripes, dots, and substitute solids won't overpower the design.
- ¼ yard of a favorite fabric for single background banner
- ¼ yard of a coordinating fabric for backing
- ½ yard flannel fabric or felt, for lining or filler
- 9" x 12" rectangle of contrasting color felt: one for short names, small letters, more for longer names and larger letters
- Rickrack in contrasting color
- Scissors, rotary cutting supplies, pins
- *Optional:* Sewing machine, thread to match or contrast with fabrics and rickrack
